RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, substance abuse among youth and adults has been identified as a major health problem and is a concern of all tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, education and training of counselors, community leaders, Judges, Social Workers, Teachers, and the youth themselves plays a vital role in the prevention and treatment of substance abuse; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to support the prevention and treatment of substance abuse through training and education; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe's Rainbow Treatment Center has been awarded a grant under the Section 4228 P.L. 99-570, the omnibus drug bill, in the amount of \$16,700.00; and
- WHEREAS, the Rainbow Treatment Center requests the Tribal Council waive indirect cost so that the full use of this grant money will greatly benefit the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the waiver of indirect costs for this training money grant.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
