RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Chief of Police, Andrew Kane, a son of Billy Kane, has come before the Tribal Council and requested by letter, authorization from the Tribal Council to transfer 240 hours of his accumulated sick leave to his brother, Steven Kane, who has volunteered to donate one of his kidneys to his father, Billy Kane; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that there is no prohibition in the Tribal Personnel Code or Policies prohibiting the transfer of sick leave from one employee to another; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised by the BIA that the transfer of sick leave hours from one employee to another is a common practice in the federal government and within the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the transfer of 240 hours of sick leave from Andrew Kane to Steven Kane.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Director of Personnel to prepare the necessary documents to transfer the 240 hours of sick leave from Andrew Kane to Steven Kane.

The foregoing resolution was on August 8, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
