## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, students representing the Alchesay High School student body have come before the Tribal Council with a request that a maximum speed limit of 25 miles per hour be established from the canteen to the airport, that crosswalks be established in front of the high school and by the old trading posts, and that signs designating bus stops be established along roads throughout the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the student representatives request that the Tribal Council request the Arizona Department of Transportation and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to establish crosswalks, bus stops and reduce the speed limit; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned about the safety of children in the area identified by the student representatives and agrees that their request should be acted upon.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Arizona Department of Transportation and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to meet and confer with the Tribal Chairman, or his authorized delegate, to coordinate and establish crosswalks at Alchesay High School and the old trading posts, to reduce the speed limit from the canteen to the airport to 25 miles per hour, and to designate by signs bus stops throughout the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 5, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
