RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Council Member, Randall Massey, Jr., advises the Tribal Council that recent heavy storms have washed away a road near the East Fork Trading Post, which is the only means of access to several homes in the area; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. massey requests Tribal Council support to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to blade the road in issue so as to make it passable to tribal members living in the area, and to enter into an intergovernmental agreement with the Tribe to loan equipment to generally service reservation communities for similar purposes and road improvement; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that Mr. Massey's request merits the support of the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to blade the road washed out by recent storms near the East Fork Trading Post so as to provide easier access for tribal members residing in that area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Tribe to loan road equipment to the Tribe to service residential communities throughout the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 5, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
