RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha that there is a serious water quality problem at FATCO housing; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has had the opportunity to inspect a sample of water from the FATCO housing, provided by Mr. Altaha, and agrees that the water appears to be polluted and unfit for human consumption; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Indian Health Service should conduct an immediate test as to the quality of water at the FATCO housing and to recommend to the Tribal Council immediate steps necessary to rectify the water quality pollution problem at FATCO housing.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Indian Health Service to conduct an immediate investigation and analysis of water quality at the FATCO housing area.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests that IHS Environmental Health Services provide a written report to the Office of the Tribal Chairman and to the Tribal Council regarding water quality at FATCO housing, whether or not it is fit for human consumption, source of the pollution, and recommendations to rectify said pollution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests that the Indian Health Service respond to the water quality problem at FATCO housing as an emergency matter.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 5, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) (i) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
