## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised by Mr. Ramon Riley, Director of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Labor Relations Department that some confusion has arisen since the Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO) was renamed the Labor Relations Department; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Riley advises that most tribes have retained that the Tribal Employment Rights Office designation and that contractors are familiar with the requirements of Tribal Employment Rights Offices and therefore Mr. Riley requests that the Tribal Council change his department's name back to TERO; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees and concurs with Mr. Riley's request.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby changes the name of the White
  Mountain Apache Labor Relations Department back to
  White Mountain Apache Tribal Employment Rights Office
  (TERO).

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 13, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (s) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
