RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney has proposed an amendment to the existing Extradition Ordinance in order to comply with recent state statutes that extradition compacts be entered into between the various Indian tribes in the State of Arizona and the State of Arizona, for the extradition of any person to and from a reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney has also submitted for Tribal Council review a proposed Elderly Abuse Ordinance whose purpose would be to protect elderly and incapacitated adults from any economic, financial, emotional or physical abuse on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requires that proposed ordinances be posted in each District on the reservation for a period of at least ten (10) days in order to obtain public comment and suggestions regarding said proposed ordinances; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the proposed Extradition Ordinance and the Elderly Abuse Ordinance should be posted for public comment in each reservation District prior to any final action by the Tribal Council.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Council Secretary to publically post the proposed Extradition and Elderly Abuse Ordinance in each district for at least ten (10) days prior to any final action by the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on October 11, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (q) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
