## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) is a medical program for which many White Mountain Apache Tribal Members are eligible; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is concerned that White Mountain Apache Tribal members receive the best medical care available to them; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is concerned over hardships suffered by White Mountain Apache Tribal members in their efforts to apply for AHCCCS eligibility; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service and Navajo County have identified and made monies available to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to provide a full-time AHCCCS Eligibility Worker and an Eligibility Clerk in Whiteriver.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Navajo County for the purpose of providing AHCCCS Eligibility services on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 28, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
