## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned about the overloading of the Cibecue Lagoon which is overflowing into Cibecue Creek; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has received a grant from the EPA as part of a demonstration project to correct the overflowing lagoon; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service is available to provide technical assistance to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the construction of an expanded treatment facility for Cibecue.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the Indian Health Service to provide technical assistance, the extent of which will be determined by the Tribal Engineering Department, but at the minimum to review the designs and to conduct periodic inspection of construction of the facilities.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 6, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
