

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, sound comprehensive planning based on knowledgeable Tribal input is an essential component of continued economic development on the White Mountain Apache Reservation; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive planning committee can be a significant aid to the decision making processes of the Tribal Council and facilitate beneficial community development on the reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration (EDA) requires that the Tribe prepare an Overall Economic Development Plan (OEDP) in order to be eligible for EDA funding; and

WHEREAS, EDA requires that the OEDP be developed by a representative committee from the Tribe that reflects the sundry economic interest of the Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints the following individuals to serve on the Overall Economic Development Planning Committee:


