

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has appointed the Indian Education Committee to plan, develop and oversee the educational needs of all White Mountain Apache children; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council and the Indian Education Committee jointly toured the 30 year old Cibecue Community School on January 30, 1991, now contracted 100% to the Cibecue Community School Board; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Education Committee unanimously supports the proposal for new school construction submitted by the Cibecue community School to the Bureau of Indian Affairs New School Construction Office in Albuquerque, New Mexico.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it fully supports the request for new school funds for new classroom construction at the Cibecue Community School and all prior communications with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and all other entities involved in new school construction funds previously submitted by the Cibecue Community School Board.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
