## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe previously authorized leases, known as the Hondah Homesite, for a term of twenty-five years with no renewal; and
- WHEREAS, some of the Hondah Homesite leases have expired or will expire in the near future; and
- WHEREAS, inquiry has been made by various homeowners as to whether or not the Tribal Council will renew expired leases for the Hondah Homesite area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed what is in the best financial and long range interest of the Tribe in respect to economic development along state highway 260, as well as the need of tribal members for residential housing; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, based upon its review and advice of consultants, that based upon the highest and best use of the Hondah Homesite area the expired leases should not be renewed.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby reaffirms its earlier decision that none of the Hondah Homesite leases that have expired or will expire will be renewed, said area being reserved for future economic development and residential needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
