

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Cibecue Community School has been operating classes from condemned trailer buildings for the past ten years due to the lack of any other adequate space for the students enrolled at the school, and

WHEREAS, the inadequacy of these trailers has been documented in inspections conducted by the Bureau of Indian Affairs Facilities Management and Construction Division and by reports from the Cibecue Community School Board, Inc., and

WHEREAS, despite these impediments, the Cibecue Community School has gained a reputation for being one of the best tribally-controlled schools in the country and is the only accredited Bureau funded school on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, most recently, on February 7, 1991, a fire destroyed two of the three trailers which has further exacerbated the overcrowded and inadequate conditions at the Cibecue Community School, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has recently learned that the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds set aside to cover emergencies affecting damaged or needed facilities.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs immediately make funding available to purchase three new double-wide trailers to replace the trailers destroyed by the fire and provide the space required by the students at the Cibecue Community School.

The foregoing resolution was on February 26, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) and (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
