

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, BIA Road 58 from the Sunrise Gas Station to the Sunrise Ski Day Lodge is in great need of repair; and
- WHEREAS, BIA Route 58 was approved and constructed by the BIA several years ago; and
- WHEREAS, said road is critical to the economic needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and Sunrise Ski Resort as it is the only means of access for up to 10,000 vehicles weekly during ski season to the Tribe's ski park, the Tribe's second largest enterprise; and
- WHEREAS, safe and easy access to the Sunrise Ski Park is essential to the economic development and success of the Ski Park and Tribal goals of self sufficiency.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the BIA undertake to soundly repair BIA Route 58 before the FY 91-92 ski season (November 1991 - April 1992) as a distinct economic development road priority separate from the Tribal Council's list of road project priorities.

The foregoing resolution was on March 14, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
