## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr., advises the Tribal Council that he has recently received information that the Elderly Feeding Program located at East Fork be shut down; and
- WHEREAS, he points out to the Tribal Council that District IV has two (2) Elderly Feeding Programs, one at Canyon Day and one at Whiteriver and he objects to shutting down the program at East Fork; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Massey reports that it is his information that the Elderly Program has become politicized in granting of benefits and where the programs are located and requests that the Tribal Council make changes as necessary or delegate authority to the Chairman to take action so that there will be no unjust treatment for the East Fork Community; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Massey also recommends that the Elderly Feeding Program in the Carrizo area be reopened; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is agreeable to looking into the matters raised by Mr. Massey.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman to review the actions of the program director for the Elderly Feeding Program to insure that the program is being administered fairly for each community and to take action after his review to insure equitable treatment for all communities on the reservation.
