- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has recognized the lack of adequate housing for many of its tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, in an attempt to alleviate some of the problems that exist regarding the <u>severe</u> shortage of housing on the reservation, and in compliance with a Bureau of Indian Affairs request, the Tribe through the efforts of the Housing Improvement Program office has complied a housing inventory survey attached hereto on Form 5-6406 and incorporated by reference herein; and
- WHEREAS, this Housing Inventory Survey, also known as Form 5-6406, must be submitted to the Phoenix Area Office by May 15, 1991 in order to identify and establish a Tribal housing need priority within the Phoenix Area Office's jurisdiction.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that after reviewing the attached Form 5-6406, it is in agreement with figures noted listing housing needs by Community.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that in compliance with the BIA Phoenix Area Office's request, it hereby submits said Housing Inventory Survey information via Fort Apache Agency Superintendent, Benjamin Nuvamsa for his approval and forwarding to the Phoenix Area Office by the May 15, 1991 deadline.

Signatures of the members of the Tribal Council represent their approval of Tribal Resolution No. 05-91-133.
