WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes it to be in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to be represented on the Sherman Indian School Board; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council hereby expresses its appreciation to present School Board Alternate Yvonna Redsteer, who has represented the interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on said Board; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Erma (Beatty) Ivins meets the requirements of Board membership and can adequately represent the interests of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby expresses its appreciation to Yvonna Redsteer for her past presentation of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on the Sherman Indian School Board.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby appoints Erma (Beatty) Ivins to serve as an alternate on the Sherman Indian School Board.

The foregoing resolution was on June 05, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
