

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the area designated South Cibecue Ridge is planned for a timber sale in April 1992; and
- WHEREAS, the area has a substantial amount of virgin timber that is not accessed by roads; and
- WHEREAS, 5.7 miles of new road up C 1 Wash and 6.4 miles of new road up Indian Canyon as depicted on the attached map are needed to access the virgin timber; and
- WHEREAS, permission to construct the roads is requested during the dry fall period, thereby allowing the roads to stabilize over the winter and to provide immediate access during the fall for necessary pre-sale timber marking; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Committee has recommended to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that these roads should be built in the fall of 1991 in order to provide early access and to facilitate timber sale preparation.


BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, hereby approves the construction of 5.7 miles of new road up C 1 Wash and 6.4 miles of new road up Indian Canyon during the fall of 1991.


The foregoing resolution was on August 06, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
