

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Coyote East Logging Unit is included in the five year timber program; and

WHEREAS, the sale contract has been prepared without a formal appraisal; and

WHEREAS, a formal appraisal will be prepared annually during the Fort Apache Timber Company reappraisal; and

WHEREAS, the Coyote East Logging Unit is in the Tribal Timber Management Block and is part of the annual allowable cut; and

WHEREAS, the Coyote East Timber Sale includes 19 road construction projects totalling 14.7 miles as follows:

Road #1	.4 mile	to access virgin area
Road #2	3.8 mile	to access virgin area
Road #3	1.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #4	.4 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #5	.4 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #6	.3 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #7	.4 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #8	.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #9	.6 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #10	1.1 mile	to access virgin area
Road #10A	.3 mile	to access virgin area
Road #11	1.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #11A	.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #12	1.2 mile	to reduce skidding costs
Road #13	1.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #14	.3 mile	to access virgin area
Road #15	.2 mile	to access virgin area
Road #16	.7 mile	to avoid an environmental hazard
Road #17	.6 mile	to access virgin area

WHEREAS, these road proposals and the sale package have been reviewed and approved by the Natural Resources Committee.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Coyote East Logging Unit, including the above-mentioned 19 road projects, as presented in the proposed contract for the sale of timber and subject to minor changes and administrative adjustments by the Approving Officer, be sold to the Fort Apache Timber Company as described below:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Chairman of Tribal Council or his representative is authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of timber for and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that deductions not to exceed thirteen percent (13%) of the gross receipts received from the Purchaser will be accrued in the Road Suspense Account until the Road Suspense Account is funded to the extent required to provide the road construction fund reserve authorized by the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on August 06, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
