


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by the Whiteriver Police Department that Tribal Council Member Virgil Hinton, Sr. suffered a heart attack and passed away while attending a revival church service in Cibecue Community on August 12, 1991; and
- WHEREAS, Virgil Hinton, Sr., was recognized by all as a good man and father to his ten (10) children, a man who truly wanted to represent his constituency and his tribe, who dedicated himself to the preservation of natural resources, positive change, and environmental beauty for his beloved homeland, who never failed to sprinkle his sharp sense of humor at council meetings, who was always candid in his thoughts and a man who was very concerned about his fellow Apache people, their safety and prosperity, the protection of their land, water rights, and right of self-determination; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is deeply saddened by his passage and wish to pay special tribute to him by designating Wednesday, August 14, 1991 as a day of mourning and remembrance for him by closing all tribal offices, programs and departments to mark his passage.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in honor of its dearly beloved brother fellow tribal member and colleague that it hereby orders the closure of all tribal business offices, programs, and departments on Wednesday, August 14, 1991 as a day of public mourning to mark Virgil Hinton Sr.'s passage from this earthly life to a new life with his Creator.

The foregoing resolution was on August 13, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
