

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has extended an invitation to the White Mountain Apache Tribe to participate in the state conducted Weatherization Assistance Programs of the U.S. Department of Energy for low-income persons; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that there is a great need on the reservation for improvement to housing structures; and

WHEREAS, by use of these identified funds the Weatherization Program can assist individuals in need of weatherization services and provide assistance to reduce the amount of fuel and energy used for space heating and cooling for those households; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe has received Notification of a Grant Award for FY 1991 commencing April 01, 1991, in the amount of \$6,460.00; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe desires to accept this amount and any other amounts granted which will increase the award; and

WHEREAS, said program funds will be used to provide services to needy program beneficiaries who will be selected based on eligibility criteria and guidelines.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Arizona Department of Commerce Energy office and any other parties appropriate and necessary for participation by the Tribe in the aforescribed Weatherization Assistance Program for FY 1991.
