## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, two wives whose husbands work as cowboys at the ID Ranch have come before the tribal Council with a complaint that their husbands were hired at \$4.25 per hour but that recently their pay has been decreased to \$18.00 per day; and
- WHEREAS, the wives further complained that the General Manager of ID Ranch is never around to coordinate daily activities for the ranch and has neglected to provide dependable transportation or a communication system for the safety and well being of the cowboys; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes based upon this information that the office of the Tribal Chairman should investigate their complaints and report back to the Tribal Council his findings.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and directs the office of the Tribal Chairman to investigate the complaints at ID Ranch and to report back to the Tribal Council upon completion of the investigation.

The foregoing resolution was on October 02, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
