


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Randall Massey, Jr., Councilmember from District III, has attempted to enter the property of the United States Government for the purposes of inspecting surplus property for possible purchase and use on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary for Randall Massey, Jr. to obtain a Government Identification card in order to enter the Property of the United States Government for the above stated purposes; and
- WHEREAS, such identification can be issued to Randall Massey, Jr. by the United States Government for the above stated purpose; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered this matter and deems it appropriate for Randall Massey, Jr. to obtain a United States Government Identification card.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves that a United States Government Identification card be issued to Randall Massey, Jr. for the purposes of entering the property of the United States Government to inspect and evaluate surplus property for possible use on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on October 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
