RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, complaints have been received by Tribal Council members regarding the Elderly Feeding Program and its operation cooperation with feeding sites in outlying communities of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, complaints have also been received by Tribal Council members regarding the Director of the Elderly Feeding Program; and
- such feeding programs are vital to the health and well-WHEREAS, being of the elderly on this reservation and if there is lack of cooperation between the Tribal Program and the feeding sites in the outlying communities, it is the elderly who will be adversely effected; and
- the Tribal Council feels that an investigation should WHEREAS, be conducted regarding the operations of the Tribal Elderly Feeding Program and its Director regarding interaction with feeding sites conducted in outlying communities, and the conduct of the Director of the Program.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Tribal Chairman investigate and interview the Director of the Elderly Feeding Program regarding these complaints.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman should report back to the Tribal Council within two (2) weeks of receipt of this resolution, his findings from the investigation.

The foregoing resolution was on October 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
