

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is presently considering changes to the Tribal Constitution and feels that the best way to have this revision made is by a referendum election; and
- WHEREAS, changes to the Tribal Constitution have been suggested and need to be investigated; and
- WHEREAS, in order to revise the Tribal Constitution, the Tribal Council needs to hold public meetings, to conduct investigations and study sessions; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs may have funding available to conduct such meetings, investigations, elections and any other necessary activities for the constitutional revision process.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency is hereby directed to locate funds to initiate the Tribal Constitution revision process.

The foregoing resolution was on October 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
