

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Vice Chairman Lafe Altaha explains to the Tribal Council that the reduction in the annual allowable cut has caused a shortage of hog lumber, which has been traditionally used by tribal members to construct enclosures for wakes; and

WHEREAS, the Vice Chairman suggests that roofing tin from the McNary Mill be used for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, after additional discussion, the Tribal Council concludes that West Anderson, Director of Community Services, be directed to remove sufficient roofing tin from the McNary Mill for the purpose of constructing portable tin enclosures for use at wakes, and that Mr. Anderson be responsible to deliver and distribute the portable tin enclosures for that purpose and to retrieve them after the wakes for storage at the Community Service Center for future use by tribal members as the need arises.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs West Anderson, Director of Community Services, to remove roofing tin from the McNary Mill for the purpose of constructing portable tin enclosures for use at wakes in substitution of hog lumber, that he be responsible for distributing said portable tin enclosures to wakes as a community service, to retrieve them after the wake is over and to store them at the Community Service Center for future needs of tribal members.

The foregoing resolution was on November 07, 1991, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
