RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to request travel funds from the Fort Apache Agency Education Office for Indian Education Committee to visit the Choctaw Mississippi Education Department and tour its schools; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is interested in establishing a comprehensive Tribal Department of Education in the near future under Public Law 100-297, Section 1142; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to request grants and technical assistance for development and operation of a tribal department of education which would plan and coordinate all education programs of the tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes it to be in the best interest of the Tribe to grant the authority to the Tribal Education Director to negotiate travel arrangements with the Agency Education Superintendent so that travel is completed within 45 days after approval of this resolution.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman and/or in his absence, the Vice Chairman are authorized and directed to sign a negotiated agreement for education travel funds to allow the Indian Education Committee and Director to visit the Choctaw Indian Tribe reservation in Choctaw, Mississippi.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>March 11, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
