RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to obtain funds for a second year to provide direct services to crime victims on the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been notified by the Tribal Health Authority that the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant currently operating on the reservation is providing necessary counseling services to children who are victims of crime; and
- WHEREAS, the refunding application for the 1992-1993 fiscal year will be submitted by March 31, 1992, to continue funding for the Victims of Crime Program to the Arizona Department of Public Safety.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes and approves the Tribal Health Authority to enter into an agreement with the Arizona Department of Public Safety for refunding of the Victim of Crime Act counseling program for October 1, 1992 to June 30, 1993.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that upon receipt of funding from the Arizona Department of Public Safety, that the grant will be implemented and monitored by the Apache Tribal Guidance Center under the auspices of Tribal Health Authority.

The foregoing resolution was on March 11, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
