- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by previous resolution endorsed and initiated the Title VI program under the Older Americans Act; and
- WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Tribal Council to continue to endorse the Title VI program in order to promote the delivery of nutritional and supportive services to Indians aged sixty (60) and older in the Whiteriver area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes and supports participation in the Title VI Part A for FY 1992 and FY 1993.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman is authorized and directed to prepare and submit an application and proposal to enter into a contract with the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration on Aging, for tribal administration of the Title VI program under the Older Americans Act in order to promote the delivery of social and nutritional services to Indians aged sixty (60) and older in the Whiteriver area on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice Chairman, is authorized to sign any and all documents required to consummate this contractual agreement for the Title VI program, and subsequent contractual agreements every year thereafter.
