RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is recognized by the United States of America as the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- whereas, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council gave its consent to Farmers Home Administration to build approximately 30 houses on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, Farmers Home Administration sold some of these homes to Manufacturers Hanover and some of which houses are being sold through foreclosure; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council desires to utilize the services of the Bureau of Indian Affairs for appraisals of fair market value for the sale of these houses so that the White Mountain Apache Tribe can evaluate and make a determination regarding purchases of said houses.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs
 to initiate and carry out the process for appraisal of
 fair market value of approximately 10 Manufacturers
 Hanover houses, for the sole benefit of the White
 Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on April 09, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
