## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the American Indian population are at high risk to health problems such as alcoholism, homicide, suicide, sexually transmitted diseases, mental health problems, and social problems; and
- whereas, the need to address the health and social problems confronting the American Indian population should be readily apparent; and
- whereas, the need to disseminate effective preventions and interventions that will aid in empowering the White Mountain Apache community to reduce the significant health risks that they face is equally apparent; and
- whereas, with the overall goal to providing improved health services to address these health problems, the staff of the Health Education and CHR Programs, will sponsor a two-day health promotion entitled, "APACHE WELLNESS"; and
- WHEREAS, the first day will consist of a conference with various health-related workshops, and the second day will consist of a health fair; and
- whereas, the Health Education and CHR Programs feel that all tribal employees will benefit from the "APACHE WELLNESS" Conference and Health Fair; and
- whereas, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to promoting and protecting the physical and emotional health and well being of all it's employees; and
- whereas, the staff of the Health Education and CHR Programs request that the Tribal Council urge tribal employees to attend the "APACHE WELLNESS" Conference and Health Fair, and to urge Tribal Enterprise, Program, and Department Supervisors to allow employees leave time in order to attend the "APACHE WELLNESS" Conference and Health Fair.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby allows it's employees to utilize their annual leave time to attend the "APACHE WELLNESS" Conference on Wednesday, April 29, 1992, with approval of their supervisors.

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it urges all tribal and community members to participate in both days of the "APACHE WELLNESS" promotion.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it shall participate in and support this "APACHE WELLNESS" promotion.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 09, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
