RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Member, Georgina Harvey has come before the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to request support and sponsorship from the Tribal Council to send her son, Garrick (O.J.) Declay to the National Youth Leadership Forum on Law Enforcement in Washington D.C., July 28, 1992 through August 2, 1992; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, upon discussion, agrees that conferences such as this are beneficial and important to the education of White Mountain Apache youth, and that O.J. Declay should have the opportunity to participate in the National Youth Leadership Forum on Law Enforcement.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Council will support O.J. Declay and sponsor him to the National Youth Leadership Forum on Law Enforcement in Washington D.C., July 28, 1992 through August 2, 1992 by providing a subsidy of \$400.00 towards Conference cost.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribal Education Department should also assist in the funding of O.J. Declay's trip to Washington D.C. for this conference, as the Tribal Education Department has the responsibility to further the education and educational opportunities of tribal members; O.J. Declay's attendance at this conference will enhance his education and is a worthwhile expenditure of scholarship monies of the Tribal Education Department.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>May 7, 1992</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
