RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the National Commission on Community Service, a federal commission, has sought applications for community service projects involving youths, age 16-25; and
- WHEREAS, Linda Tani, Director of Human Resources and the Planning Department submitted a grant application to the National Commission on Community Service requesting funding to provide community service projects, and employ 75-100 youths on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- whereas, the National Commission on Community Service has notified the Tribe that the application submitted is a finalist for grant funding to promote and conduct community service projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in the amount of \$296,000 and such funding is scheduled to begin in July, 1992; and
- whereas, in order for the Tribe to receive the grant funding, the Tribe must provide matching funds equal to 25% of the grant, or \$74,000, and a portion of the matching funds may be "in kind services" upon approval of the National Commission on Community Service; and
- whereas, the proposed service projects are 1) to provide assistance to Home Improvement Program, 2) to establish a conservation program, and 3) to establish a Youth Center program in Whiteriver and Cibecue with the assistance of the Athletic Department; and these programs will enroll 75 to 100 youths who will be paid a living allowance not to exceed \$4.30 per hour; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe believes that this program is worthwhile and necessary to assist the young people on the Reservation to achieve their full potential as well as provide much needed services to the community at large; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council agree to provide the matching funding, in some combination of in-kind services and capital, in order to receive the community services grant from the National Commission on Community Services.

- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the acceptance of the Community Service Grant from the National Commission on Community Service, and that the grant shall be administered by the Human Resources Director.
- provide matching funds by in-kind services and cash in the total amount of \$74,000, to be combined with the grant funds for use by the above-designated community services projects as they are spelled out in the attached grant application material.

The foregoing resolution was on May 20, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (j) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
