- 4. Resolution No. <u>02-93-038</u> was adopted authorizing expenditure of \$2,487 from the East Fork Land Claims fund to purchase and install a baseball backstop and two complete basketball goals.
- 5. Resolution No. <u>02-92-039</u> was adopted authorizing a withdrawal of \$102.00 electric bill for the Seven Mile basketball court from the Seven Mile Community Land Claims fund.
- 6. A completed copy of the proposed Tort Claims Ordinance will be presented at the next council meeting.
- 7. Resolution No. 02-92-040 was adopted approving the 638 contract funding increase for Tribal Courts.
- 8. Resolution No. <u>02-92-041</u> was adopted establishing a local apprenticeship training program.

- 4. Resolution No. 02-92-025 was adopted approving council meeting briefs of November 7, 8, 13, 1991; and December 4, 12, 1991.
- 5. Resolution No. <u>02-92-026</u> was adopted directing FATCO to pay Darvin Burnette \$259.29 for a salary increase that Mr. Burnette did not receive due to an oversight.
- 6. Resolution No. 02-92-027 was adopted approving authority for tribal member Gina (Lee) Webster to purchase a Hondah homesite home.
- 7. Tribal member Krista (Tessay) Johnson and legal representative, Dennis Chappabitty addressed the Tribal Council to request tribal assistance with a dispute between Mrs. Johnson and Brian Blow which is currently scheduled for court. Tribal Council concluded to let legal process take its course.
- 8. Resolution No. 02-92-028 was adopted approving authority for tribal member Isaiah Lee to purchase a Hondah homesite home.
- 9. Russell Henry presented the Misc. Forest products for September 1, 1991 to September 30, 1992.
- 10. The meeting recessed at 11:53 a.m. and reconvened at 1:45 p.m.
- 11. After a lengthy discussion on the misc. forest product presentation, Mr. Henry was instructed to return to the Tribal Council after the election.
- 12. Resolution No. 02-92-029 was adopted directing the Maintenance department in coordination with the Election Commission shall construct access to polling sites for the handicapped.
- 13. Resolution No. 02-92-030 was adopted directing the Legal Department to investigate whether a claim can be made against the insurance company insuring the airplane that crash landed on Zunie Alekay's farmland in Carrizo; and that the Land Office and BIA Land Operations prepare a cost estimate for repair of the fencing and restoring the damage farmland.
- 14. Resolution No. 02-92-031 was adopted to restore \$7500 to the Tribal Attorney budget, transferring \$2500 to the Tribal Council Secretary for salary obligations.
- 15. Resolution No. <u>02-92-032</u> was adopted authorizing the McNary Community to withdraw \$800 from the McNary Land Claims fund for a ski trip for 79 tribal members students.

- 16. Resolution No. <u>02-92-033</u> was adopted appointing Tina Beall and Lolita Endfield as alternate members of the Sherman Indian School Board.
- 17. Resolution No. 02-92-034 was adopted appointing additional members to the Law and Order Committee.
- 18. Resolution No. 02-92-035 was adopted recontracting 638 Education program contracts.

8. Resolution No. <u>02-92-024</u> was adopted demanding that the Phoenix Area Office provide full accounting of the monies remaining in the Miner Flat Dam fund as well as monies previously transferred for any purposes.

- 7. Resolution No. 01-92-015 was adopted requesting BIA to perform an appraisal of the Cibecue Commercial Center to determine fair market value for the purpose of space subleasing.
- 8. Resolution No. 01-92-016 was adopted requesting BIA Superintendent to conduct a feasibility study within 90 days of the Roads Department with emphasis regarding the feasibility of the Tribe taking over the Roads Maintenance responsibilities.

9. The meeting recessed at 12:00 p.m. for lunch and reconvened at 1:35 p.m.

10. Resolution No. <u>01-92-017</u> was adopted requesting that the BIA Superintendent establish substations for Land Operations, Forestry and Roads in Cibecue to improve services.

11. Resolution No. 01-92-018 was adopted placing Wesley Alchesay, Carlena (Clarkson) Thompson and Myron Ethelbah on the HIP priority list.

12. Erv Kulosa presented the Proposed Phased Plan and Budget for Tribal Forestry for Tribal Council review and information.

13. Resolution No. 01-92-019 was adopted authorizing the Tribal Chairman to contribute \$5000 to pay for a private investigator and public relations firm in preparation of litigation against the State of Arizona regarding gaming issues.

Chairman Lupe called the special council meeting to order at 10:27 a.m.

Opening prayer was offered by Councilmember Kino Kane. 2.

- Councilmember Kino Kane addressed the Tribal Council with 3. great concern regarding the memo from John E. Brach, KNNB Board Chairman, dated 01/14/92, requesting that councilmember radio reports be pre-recorded at least one day in advance, and further that these reports should not oppose or support any tribal candidate. This request, Mr. Kane claims imposes an unnecessary burden on the councilmembers and should be dealt with immediately before the upcoming and future elections.
- Recently, in all fairness, the Tribal Council decided that 4. radio reports for those councilmember who are qualified candidates would be canceled until after the general election, but those that were not candidates could continue to make their radio reports as scheduled.

A councilmember who is not a candidate was advised by KNNB 5. that his report would be interrupted if he should make any

political remarks.

After discussion the Tribal Council concludes that the pre-6. taping policy requested by KNNB is contrary to the mission of KNNB and constitutes a form of harassment of officials.

Further discussion reveals that the Cibecue radio transmitter 7. is in need of repair and as a result the community is

currently without radio reception.

The Tribal Council was also advised that the current Board of 8. Directors were not appointed by the Tribal Council as required by KNNB Articles of Incorporation and therefore, appointments

should be made at the next regular council meeting.

Resolution No. 01-92-020 was adopted repealing KNNB request to 9. pre-tape council reports; reaffirming Chairman Ronnie Lupe's letter to KNNB Director dated January 9, 1992; directing Chairman Ronnie Lupe to issue an executive memo prohibiting use of tribal government property by candidates and placing campaign bumper stickers on any tribal property; and that appointments for the KNNB Board of Directors be scheduled for the next regular council meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 11:40 a.m. 10.

5. Resolution <u>01-92-002</u> No. was adopted placing Patterson on the HIP priority list and/or the HUD list, whichever is constructed first.

- Resolution No. 01-92-003 was adopted placing Brenda Ethelbah 6. on the HIP priority list.
- Resolution No. 01-92-004 was adopted to initiate lobbying 7. efforts so that the HIP budget will not be further reduced this fiscal year.
- 8. Director Phoebe Nez addressed the Tribal requesting that Tribal Council members should be temporarily prohibited from using KNNB until after the General Election. The Tribal Council concluded that KNNB will honor the revised radio schedule submitted by the Vice Chairman.

Resolution No. 01-92-005 was adopted certifying candidates 9. for the 1992 Primary and General Election.

- Resolution No. 01-92-006 was adopted directing Maintenance and Utility authority to assist the Election Commission with polling site repairs.
- Resolution No. 01-92-007 was adopted approving a Sunrise Dance request for Manuel & Caroline (Cheney) Tenijieth during 11. the week-end of May 8-10, 1992. 12.

Tribal member Tina Cruz requested another road entrance to her homesite immediately. 13.

- Non-tribal member Delbert Keys approached the Tribal Council requesting assistance with firewood, lumber and insulation for home improvement, Councilmember Randall Massey, Jr. will contact Tribal programs that maybe able to assist. 14.
- The meeting recessed at 11:49 a.m. and reconvened at 1:40

Brief general report by the Vice Chairman. 15.

Ivan Sidney from NAU addressed the Tribal Council with a 16. presentation that NAU can provide education opportunities for the Tribe in form of a partnership.

17. Claude Butler on behalf of Ted Wilbert Associates requested extension on an existing resolution. After discussion, Mr. Butler was directed to the FATCO Board for further consideration by the Tribal Council.

18. General report by Council member Kino Kane.

- 19. Resolution No. <u>01-92-008</u> was adopted directing IHS to provide water to the homes of Ben Hendricks and Paul Declay, Sr. in North Fork.
- 20. Resolution No. <u>01-92-009</u> was adopted directing Land Operations to curtail erosion problem behind Nancy Armstrong's home in Cedar Creek, and Larry Massey's farmland along the Whiteriver in Canyon Day.
- 21. Resolution No. 01-92-010 was adopted that all public modern dances be prohibited from being held on holy days throughout the reservation and further that the curfew ordinance shall be enforced.
- 22. Resolution No. <u>01-92-011</u> was adopted that improvements to the Seven Mile Community building and basketball court shall be financed by the Seven Mile Community Land Claim funds.
- 23. Resolution No. <u>01-92-012</u> was adopted urging WMAHA to actively support the proposal to construct 20 rental units in East Fork.
- 24. The meeting recessed at 4:45 p.m. and will reconvene the following day at 9:00 a.m.
