## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the fire protection to the citizens of the Cibecue Community is a vital concern to the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council; and
- whereas, the equipment is not adequate to meet the fire protection needs of this community and the lack of adequate fire protection has resulted in a moratorium on new housing in the community; and
- whereas, because of the expansion of grade levels at the Cibecue Community School and the addition of two new modular classroom buildings, space to house fire protection equipment is no longer available at the Cibecue Community School; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is applying for a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of approximately \$730,000 to provide for a much needed fire station, fire fighting vehicles and related fire fighting and fire station equipment.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby commits the amount of \$185,000 to be used as the Tribe's contribution on this project; said funding for the Tribe's contribution to the HUD Community Development Block Grant application for the Cibecue Community Fire Protection Program to come from the General Fund of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 21, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>five</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (b) (f) (h) (i) (j) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
