RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- whereas, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been actively involved in solving the problems of solid waste collection and disposal on the reservation since December, 1990 when the Solid Waste Committee was established by Tribal Resolution; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has rendered valuable assistance in quantifying the solid waste problem and casting a solution; and
- whereas, to fully consider an integrated solid waste management system, "gaps" in existing plans such as scheduling, impact and viability of recycling, and a community education program as to the nature and magnitude of the problem and the operations of the systems are required; and
- whereas, the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona has been successful in its efforts to secure funding to enable tribes to initiate planning for integrated solid waste management systems and is inviting proposals from tribe to develop such plans.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Planning Department is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a grant application to ITCA to close the gaps in the Tribe's existing planning efforts.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 21, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of \underline{six} for and \underline{zero} against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (b) (h) (j) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
