RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- Councilmember Judy Dehose reports to the Tribal Council WHEREAS, that present BIA road construction on Oak Creek Road is utilizing clay which is unsuitable during the rainy season, the oncoming winter and spring, making traffic over the road difficult; and
- Councilmember Judy Dehose suggests to the Tribal Council WHEREAS, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Road Department be directed to use dry river-run rock rather than clay on the Oak Creek Road so that the road will hold up for more than one season and will not be affected in wet weather presently experienced by the clay road; and
- the Tribal Council concurs with Councilmember Judy WHEREAS. Dehose's suggestion.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the BIA Roads Department to use dry river-run rock and not clay on the Oak Creek Road for the reasons state herein.

The foregoing resolution was on August 06, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (s) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
