RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that gates in the area of Nash Creek at the top of Seven Mile Hill are often left open by persons using the area for recreation, thereby allowing cattle to graze outside the gate; and
- WHEREAS, the Council is advised that the BIA roads department has an adequate supply of cattle guards which could be installed in the vicinity of Nash Creek at the location of the two gates, which would resolve the cattle problem.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Fort Apache Agency Superintendent, Ben Nuvamsa, direct the Agency Roads Department to install two cattle guards at Nash Creek at the top of Seven Mile Hill to each gate in order to prevent cattle from moving outside the fenced area.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 12, 1992</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
