RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council desires to obtain funds for direct services to crime victims on the reservation and for prevention of domestic violence; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council has been notified of the request for proposals for the Fiscal Year 1992 Indian Child Protection and Child Abuse Prevention Demonstration Projects Grant for American Indians and Alaska Natives; and
- whereas, the Tribal Health Authority has prepared a grant application and proposal to provide direct services to victims of crime and for prevention of domestic violence to be submitted to the United States Department of Health and Human Services; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council agrees that a grant application and proposal should be submitted for the 1992 Indian Child Protection and Child Abuse Prevention Demonstration Projects Grant for American Indians and Alaska Natives, and that Tribal Health Authority and Tribal Social Services should work together to implement the program if it is awarded to the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Health Authority and Tribal Social Services to prepare the grant application and proposal for submission to the Department of Health and Human Services.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council that Chairman Ronnie Lupe, or in his absence Vice-Chairman Lafe Altaha, are hereby authorized and delegated to sign any application and grant forms in order to complete the grant application.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 12, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
