RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a large number of social service needs; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has instigated and authorized numerous programs designed to serve needs of Tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the number of such programs requires close coordination
 between and among programs; and
- whereas, the ability of the Tribe to more adequately meet the needs of Tribal members would be enhanced by a grant write devoted solely to social and human service programs; and
- whereas, the Federal Administration for Children and Families has a Community Services Block Grant program whereby the Tribe may secure funding for a Human Service Coordinator/Planner.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby ratifies and approves funding for a grant in the amount of \$44,408.07.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman, and in his absence, the Vice Chairman to sign any and all documents necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 28, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
