RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

whereas, the Tribal Council has received numerous complaints from tribal members farming in the Canyon Day area that several bulls owned by Eddie Hastings are being allowed to run at large throughout Canyon Day farmland causing destruction to farmland fences, crops and farmland generally, and that Eddie Hastings has not acted sufficiently to control the bulls and that they continue to be a menace to people and property in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is requested to direct Tribal Chairman Ronnie Lupe to notify Eddie Hastings of his liability for damage to persons and property of Canyon Day.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Tribal Chairman Ronnie Lupe to give written notice to Eddie Hastings of his potential liability under existing tribal ordinances for allowing his bulls to remain at large and for their destruction to farmland, crops and fences, as well as potential liability for injury to persons.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 10, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) (q) (s) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
