## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, members of the Tribal Council have inquired as to the increasing representation from District IV due to population growth in that district; and
- WHEREAS, the request for additional representation based upon population growth involves issues of redistricting and reapportionment; and
- whereas, the Tribal Election Commission is the appropriate entity to study the issue of redistricting and reapportionment of voting districts within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
  Tribe that it hereby requests the Tribal Election
  Commission to conduct a study of redistricting and
  reapportionment requirements on the Fort Apache Indian
  Reservation and report back to the Tribal Council at the
  regularly scheduled January 1993 Tribal Council meeting,
  with the results of said study.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>November 04, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) (s) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
