## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is WHEREAS. advised by Alvino Hawkins, Tribal Safety Officer, in charge of the Tribal Safety Department, that the Tribe needs to regulate the use of the Whiteriver public dump to prevent disposal of toxic wastes that pollute tribal lands and waters; and
- WHEREAS, burning also creates a hazard to tribal members from foul air and from the risk of fire spreading; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Hawkins proposes that tribal members not be charged for the use of the dump but that solid waste regulator employees will direct proper dumping of solid waste at the public dump; and
- Mr. Hawkins advises that the Whiteriver public dump WHEREAS, should no longer accept the following toxic waste: automobile batteries, scrap metals, auto parts and tires.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby prohibits dumping of toxic waste and burning at the Whiteriver dump.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the dump shall be open from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. seven (7) days per week.

The foregoing resolution was on November 04, 1992, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) (s) (u) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
