RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, United States Senator Dennis Deconcini, has nominated Janet Napolitano, to take the position as U.S. Attorney for Arizona; and
- whereas, the Tribal Council is well aware of Ms. Napolitano's devotion to public service and believe she will be sensitive to law enforcement issues confronting Native Americans and that her sensitivity, legal experience, level headedness and overall professionalism, qualify her as the most outstanding candidate for the position of United States Attorney for the District of Arizona.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the nomination of Janet Napolitano to be the next United States Attorney for the District of Arizona.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the Tribal Chairman to deliver to the Honorable Dennis Deconcini, a copy of this resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby expresses its appreciation to Senator Deconcini for nominating a candidate who will be sensitive to the law enforcement needs of Native Americans in the State of Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 14, 1992</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
