## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the State Parks Department has announced that grant funds are available for outdoor recreation; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has identified a need for a park in Whiteriver to serve the residents of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and to accommodate visitors; and
- whereas, a detailed cost estimate reveals that Phase I, consisting of site work, landscaping, picnic tables, and grills will cost approximately \$60,000; and
- WHEREAS, the grant requires a match of 50% of the project costs;
  and
- WHEREAS, Navajo County has obligated \$5,000 as match for the grant.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves submission of a grant application be submitted for funding for Phase I of the Community Park.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Tribe commit \$25,000 as match for the grant and utilize the \$5,000 from Navajo County as the balance of the match.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 16, 1993</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>seven</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (h) (i) (j) (k) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
