

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a continuing need to provide employment and income for its Tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, one possibility of providing additional employment and income to Tribal members lies within the cutting and sale of firewood; and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has provided the White Mountain Apache Tribe with a \$60,000 grant for establishment of a Woodland Fuelwood Enterprise through June 30, 1994; and
- WHEREAS, a group of Fort Apache Timber Company employees and others have held a series of meetings to review all means for accomplishing the purposes of the grant; and
- WHEREAS, the group has determined that the best potential for the purchase of firewood from Tribal members and sale of firewood to non-tribal members would be with the establishment of a retail woodyard adjacent to the FATCO Home Center north of Hondah.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the establishment of a woodyard on two lots immediately south of the FATCO Home Center as depicted on the attached map.



LEGAL DESCRIPTION FOR FATCO WOOD YARD BUSINESS SITE

A PARCEL OF LAND SITUATED IN THE HONDAH AREA WITHIN THE PROJECTED NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 15, T8N, R23E, G&SRB&M ON THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION, NAVAJO COUNTY, STATE OF ARIZONA, BEING MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS.

COMMENCING AT A U.S. DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT BRASS CAP, MARKED AS ANGLE POINT # 281 ON THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION BOUNDARY, BEING WITHIN SECTION 10, T8N, R23E, AND RUNNING.

THENCE S31°34'20"E (AN ASSUMED MAGNETIC BEARING) FOR A DISTANCE OF 351.61 FEET; THENCE S22°05'37"E FOR A DISTANCE OF 1,449.59 FEET; THENCE S22°59'11"E FOR A DISTANCE OF 650.05 TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

THENCE S22°59'11"E FOR A DISTANCE OF 400.00 FEET;
THENCE S67°00'49"W FOR A DISTANCE OF 190.00 FEET;
THENCE N22°59'11"W FOR A DISTANCE OF 400.00 FEET;
THENCE N 67°00'49"E FOR A DISTANCE OF 190.00 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.
