

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Arizona Game and Fish Department has requested permission from the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to continue its bald eagle management program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Arizona bald eagle management program will assist the recovery of the bald eagle in the southwest; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further concludes that it would be in the best interest for the preservation of the bald eagle to allow the Arizona Game and Fish Department to continue its bald eagle management program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to the Arizona Game and Fish Department to continue its bald eagle management program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the project include White Mountain Apache Tribal Members should there be an interest from Tribal Members to participate in the project.

The foregoing resolution was on January 05, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
