RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development was appropriated \$2,700,000,000 for modernization nationally for the Comprehensive Improvement Program and Comprehensive Grant Program (CGP) and of the amount \$3,350,564 is available for CGP; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority is eligible for modernization grant under the CGP under a grant formula based upon its calculated share of the CGP funds; and
- WHEREAS, these CGP funds would be available to the Housing Authority to provide for modernization of existing homes under the Housing Authority program, and this money would be used to bring residential structures up to standards, including correcting any architectural, material, and design deficiencies; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority, beginning in Federal fiscal year 1994 will be eligible for \$3,350,564 in the Comprehensive Grant Program and further the Housing Authority is eligible for a five year program; and
- WHEREAS, these funds would be used to rehabilitate and modernize older housing projects built by the Housing Authority, which individual homes are least three (3) years old and the homebuyer is still making payments to the Housing Authority; this program applies to Old Mutual Help, New Mutual Help and Rental Housing; and
- WHEREAS, in order to qualify for the grant the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority must submit an application package to the Department of Housing and Urban Development by July 15, 1994, and such application must consist of a Comprehensive Plan, a Five-Year Action Plan, and an Annual Statement in addition to a Tribal Council Resolution; and
- WHEREAS, older housing projects on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are in dire need of modernization, and rehabilitation, and this CGP would assist the Housing Authority in bringing homes up to standard, and provide tribal members with much needed services and assistance; and

- WHEREAS, given the shortage of available housing, and the poor condition of some Housing Authority housing project, the Tribal Council believes that receipt of this Grant would greatly benefit the Tribe and individual tribal members.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authorities efforts to secure this Grant to assist tribal members, and to bring substandard homes into compliance with standards of decency.
- BEIT FURTHERRESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the White Mountain Apache Tribal Housing Authority to submit its application for funding under the five (5) year Comprehensive Grant Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 14, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (m), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
