

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** tribal member, Tysha Quinn Lupe has come before the Tribal Council with the request that she be granted an educational stipend in the amount of \$1,500.00 from the Tribal Education Department; and

**WHEREAS,** Ms. Lupe explains to the Tribal Council that she has never qualified or received any education grants from the Education Department; and

**WHEREAS,** Ms. Lupe has done well at Georgetown University and has earned money through tuition, federal grants, scholarships from the University, loans and work study, but still is \$1,500.00 short of her needs; and


**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council concludes that Ms. Lupe should receive \$1,500.00 grant from the Tribal Education Department in view of her achievements and need.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Education Department to immediately award Tysha Quinn Lupe a grant of \$1,500.00 from the Student Education Grant Fund.

The foregoing resolution was on August 03, 1994, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (i), (k), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
