RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member, Arnold Kaytoggy has come before the Tribal Council and explained that he still has not received a HIP house and will soon be homeless; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by the Bureau of Indian Affairs that the prior funding level for HIP Housing was reduced by half; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, due to the great need of housing on the Reservation, that the 1995 HIP Housing funding level be restored to its prior level of \$366,000 and that Arnold Kaytoggy be placed on the 1995 HIP Priority List.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs restore funding for the HIP Housing to its prior level of \$366,000.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs to place tribal member, Arnold Kaytoggy on the 1995 HIP Housing Priority List without delay.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 03, 1994</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (c), (i), (j), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
